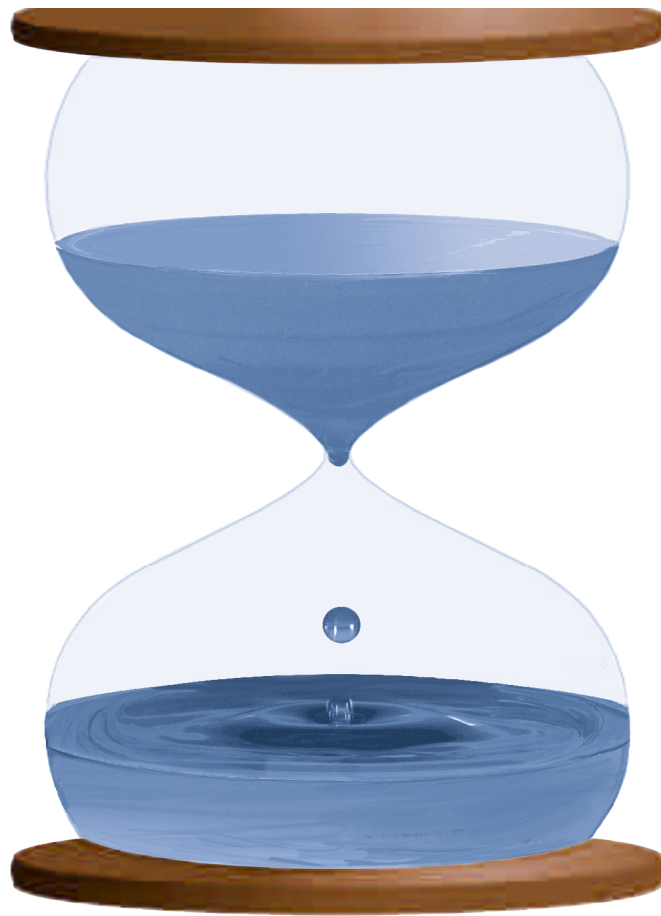

Pilot Plant and Griggs Reservoir Green Improvements Tour

Please join us Thursday, September 23, 2010, from 8:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. for a tour of the pilot plant at the Dublin Road Water Plant (DRWP) and the Griggs Reservoir Green Infrastructure Improvements.

Columbus, working with AECOM consultants is evaluating upgrades for DRWP. This study will evaluate existing treatment, identify alternatives for upgrade and expansion, and a multi-train pilot study to evaluate the alternatives. The pilot study includes all water quality, seasonal and operating variations.

Pilot Train 1 has AquaDAF™ clarification, Accelator® softening, recarbonation, rapid sand filtration, RO and blending with re-mineralization. Train 2 has Actiflo® clarification, mixed media filtration, & RO. Train 3 has Zenon ZeeWeed® UF pretreatment and RO.

This tour will also showcase green watershed improvements being made to enhance water quality in the Scioto River at Griggs Reservoir, the water source for the DRWP. Columbus, in consultation with Stantec and Williams Creek, is completing these improvements at all reservoirs to reduce contaminants entering from neighboring municipal stormwater systems, roads and parking lots.

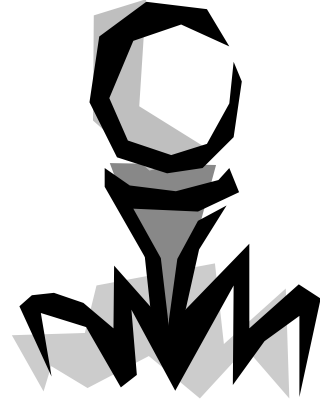
